This is a **monumental proposal**, and suggests changes in policy, procedure, and operation which will affect our libraries and our users and our colleges. Your Executive Board will prepare a position paper encompassing issues, concerns, ideas and other suggestions, support or non-support. **We will be depending on you to communicate your views on the Plan to us!** Watch for more information from your Executive Board soon!

CHANCELLOR'S OFFICE SETS SPECIAL MEETING TO REVIEW AND DISCUSS CCC LIBRARY & LEARNING PROGRAMS ISSUES, PLAN

A special Preconference meeting focused on the issues, concerns, plans and activities of the 100+ Library and Learning Resources Programs -- and how they might be reshaped by a different statewide approach -- has been announced by Carolyn Norman, Coordinator at the Chancellor's Office. The meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, April 12, 1994 in San Jose, one day before the start of the 3rd Chancellor's Spring Conference begins.

The Chancellor's Office will be sending complete information, copies of documents, and registration materials out to each Library/LRC. Included in the packet will be a copy of the proposed Master Plan for Library and Learning Resources Programs, which will be presented to the Board of Governors in July for adoption.

SUBJECT: Library and Learning Resources Preconference--April 12, 1994

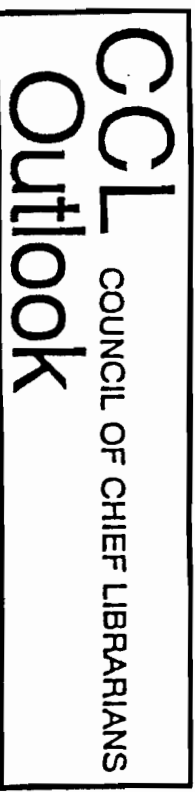
